GREEN CONTAINER	
DO	DO NOT
<p>GLASS</p> <p>Glass bottles (any colour)</p> <p>Glass jars</p> <p>Cosmetic and perfume jars</p>	<p>Car windscreen Light bulbs Mirrors Window glass Strip lights</p> <p><i>(These items must be left at the Puntos Limpios (Clean Spots) or Centros de Recogida y Reciclaje *(Collection and Recycling Centres))</i></p>

Recommendation: Remove glass jars screw tops before taking them to container.

- Ask your town hall for information.

BLUE CONTAINER	
DO	DO NOT
<p>Newspapers and magazines</p> <p>Advertising leaflets</p> <p>Small cardboard boxes (biscuits, soap powder)</p> <p>Egg cardboard containers</p> <p>Paper bags</p>	<p>Cartons</p> <p>Nappies</p> <p>Dirty paper or wax, metallic or plasticized paper</p>

Recommendation: Fold cardboard before placing in the container. Do not leave any boxes outside the container.



YELLOW CONTAINER

<p>Metallic containers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drink cans (beer, soft drinks) • Tins (vegetables, meat, fish, pet food...) • Spray cans (deodorant, hairspray, kitchen cleaning products, wood polishing...) • Aluminium plates and trays (i.e., fast food) • Metal sheets and cans 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Organic waste • Glass containers • Paper and cardboard • Toys • White goods • Feeding bottles • Rubber gloves • Kitchen utensils • Fruit boxes • Plastic buckets • Batteries
<p>Carton</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Milk, cream, milkshake, juice, wine, soup cartons... 	
<p>Food plastic containers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bottles (water, soft drinks, milk, juice, edible oil, vinegar, sauce...) • Dairy containers (yoghurt, caramel custard and other dairy products, cheese, butter, margarine...) • Styrofoam trays and boxes (packed fruit, vegetables, meat, chicken and fish, and those containing some type of ice-cream); plastic egg boxes; disposable plastic glasses, plates and cutlery; plastic tops and caps, etc. 	
<p>Plastic containers for hygiene and cleaning products</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plastic jars for hygiene products (shampoo, lotions, deodorant, toothpaste, shower gel, liquid soap ...) • Plastic jars for cleaning products (domestic cleaning products, bleach, ammonia, softener, liquid detergent and washing powder, cleaning sprays...) 	



Plastic and aluminium bags and wrappings

- Food plastic bags (of milk, frozen food, fruit, vegetables, bread, pastries, pasta, pulses, cereals...)
- Food aluminium bags and containers (children's food, soup, purée, precooked pastas, coffee, snacks, nuts, chips, fast food trays...)
- Bags from shops, supermarkets, laundries, etc., to carry the purchased products...)
- Butcher's products containers (cold meat, ham, bacon, cheese...)
- Plastic wrappings (cling film which goes on the trays of meat, fruit, vegetables and fish; the film which wraps a lot of magazines, parts, media...; the one used to protect cardboard and plastic boxes, etc.)
- Polyethylene or aluminium film (the one bought in spools and which is used to wrap fresh food)
- The plastic and aluminium contained in the blister containers (where the batteries or razors are sold, etc.)

Recommendation: Clean the containers and flatten them to reduce volume before throwing them in the container.
